

GENERAL ORDINATION EXAMINATION - 1990

This information is placed here at the direction of the General Board of Examining Chaplains.

The GBEC is agreed that we should be "up front" in our communications with GOE Candidates, Deans, Bishops, Commissions on Ministry, and in our Report to General Convention, as to what we think we are doing. Accordingly,

We view the GOE as an exercise integrative of all fields of theological education, in all of the questions asked;

We ask questions that we expect people to be able to answer, and the exam is composed with two and a half years of seminary education, or its equivalent, in mind as the educational background expected in the Candidate;

We view the exam as diagnostic and remedial, to help Commissions on Ministry prepare Candidates for continuing education in Diaconal and early-Priesthood years.

In each part of the exam, Candidates are reminded that we are looking for theological substance in the responses.

SET I (OPEN-BOOK)

SET I (OPEN-BOOK)

Respond to either  
QUESTION A

(The main emphases of this question are in the areas of Liturgics and Theory & Practice.)

You are the new Rector of a parish with about 200 members. The previous Rector had a long tenure, during which his liturgical preferences had become well-established. You would like to make some changes, especially as to the participation of lay persons in liturgical roles.

1. Why should you involve lay people in decision-making about worship in the parish?
2. In what ways would you involve them in decision making?
3. What liturgical roles do you see as appropriate for lay persons?
4. On what basis would you select lay liturgical ministers? What criteria would you use?
5. On what basis would you select lay members of the worship committee? What criteria would you use?
6. How would you introduce these changes to the parish?
7. How would you measure the value of these changes over time?

or QUESTION B

(The main emphases of this question are in the areas of Liturgics and Theory & Practice.)

The Bishop is coming! The Bishop is coming! The Bishop is coming!

So what?

As priest-in-charge of a small congregation preparing for the Bishop's visitation, you and the Bishop's Committee (Vestry) are concerned that many members of the congregation see the diocese and bishop as remote, not much related to their congregational life.

1. The Bishop's Committee asks you to prepare a presentation for the congregation concerning the visit. Draw on your knowledge of Scripture, the Prayer Book, Church History, and Theology, and your understanding of their significance for the world in which we live, and write a presentation in which you:
  - a. Discuss the importance of the role of the laity in relation to the various ministries of the church, including episcopacy.
  - b. Explain your understanding of the role of the episcopacy in the life of the church and its importance to the congregation.
2. Draw up an outline for the service, including a Baptism, for the Sunday of Proper 15, Year A. Select hymns from The Hymnal 1982 and explain your choices.

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SET II (OPEN-BOOK)

You receive this set on Thursday afternoon at 2:00 p.m. You are to hand in the completed response not later than 5:00 p.m. the same day. Thus you have three hours for Set II.

Type (or write) on only one side of the paper. Use letter-size paper (8 1/2" X 11"), not legal size, and not the kind you tear off a pad, but separate sheets.

This set consists of ONE essay which is to be chosen from the two offered on the reverse side. Please limit your answer to 1500 words. (We do not expect you to spend time counting words. We estimate 250 words to a double-spaced page of elite type, or 200 words per page of pica type.)

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SET II (OPEN-BOOK)

Respond to either  
Question A

(The main emphasis of this question is in the field of Ethics/Moral Theology. Another area involved is Contemporary Society.)

Individuals and interest groups in the Church have been calling on dioceses to speak out and provide prophetic witness on a range of contemporary issues. Write an essay in which you define the task of the Church as it faces contemporary moral issues. Use the following questions as a framework for your essay, and illustrate your remarks with reference to one specific issue.

1. Why is the specific issue you have chosen important to Christians as Christians?
2. To what end do we address members of the Church as individuals? as a community of faith?
3. To what end do we address society at large? What are the limits and problems inherent in speaking in a pluralistic society to the issue you have chosen to discuss? On what basis can the Church claim an audience?

or Question B

(The main emphasis of this question is in the area of Ethics/Moral Theology. Another area involved is Theory & Practice of Ministry.)

Write an essay on the moral and spiritual life. Your essay should include responses to the following:

1. Differentiate between moral and ascetical theology in terms of their tasks.
2. How do moral and ascetical theology contribute to the moral and spiritual life?
3. Illustrate how the moral and the spiritual are related in two of the following four selections:
  - a. Evangelism  
or  
The development of mission strategy
  - b. Ministry to the homeless  
or  
Ministry to persons with AIDs
  - c. Preparation of persons for baptism
  - d. Spiritual direction

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SET III (OPEN-BOOK)

You receive this Set Friday morning at 9:00 a.m. and it is to be handed in not later than 5:00 p.m. the same day.

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SET III (OPEN-BOOK)

USE YOUR TIME WISELY - ALL DAY, 5 PARTS

(The main emphases of this question are in the areas of Scripture, History, Theology, and Theory & Practice. Another area involved is Contemporary Society.)

As you are preparing for the patronal festival at Holy Trinity Church, members of your Adult Inquirers' Class have questioned the usefulness of the doctrine of the Trinity as a means of understanding the reality of God. You intend to respond to their question by means of a sermon and a class.

1. A. In preparation for your sermon, briefly exegete the proper readings for Trinity Sunday from Lectionary C. How do the readings contribute to a Trinitarian understanding of God?

B. What are two major points that you would develop in your sermon?

2. As background for the class meetings, set forth the historical and theological development of the doctrine of the Trinity in the first four centuries of the Church's life.

3. Detail the theological content that you hope to communicate to the group through an educational program.

4. In the light of your group's concern, what do you see to be the implications for pastoral care and mission arising out of the doctrine of the Trinity?

5. Develop a design for the class that will enable the members of the group to identify:

- a) the importance of the doctrine of the Trinity in understanding God;
- b) the Trinitarian understanding of God as reflected in the life and work of the Church and in the life of the congregation.

QUESTION

(The main emphases of this question are in the areas of Scripture, Church History, and Contemporary Society.)

You are the rector of a middle-sized parish in a diocese that has experienced much conflict during the last fifteen years. Issues confronting the whole Episcopal Church have sharply divided your diocese and its parishes. There has been considerable conflict over such matters as: the ordination of women, changing attitudes toward human sexuality, divestiture of diocesan & parish assets in South Africa, programs for the poor and homeless, and so on.

Your bishop has asked you to devise a presentation on "Conflict in the Church" for the next clergy conference. You decide that a kind of case-study approach will facilitate discussion and foster applicable learnings for the clergy. Write an essay that includes the substance of your presentation for that conference.

State how the result of the conflict shaped the life and mission of the People of God. Finally, in your judgment, what factors led to division among the People of God? What factors helped to bring about unity?

Using the insights gained from your study of scripture and history, choose a contemporary conflict in the Church and indicate how you would advise your diocesan family to approach it.
